January 21, 2017 Rally at Broome County Courthouse

[There were over 3000 people at the rally. Following is taken from remarks made by Jim Clune.]

Broome County Peace Action has been active for over thirty years, doing education and public events. **Broome County Veterans for Peace** is also active and many of our members are in DC today for the Woman's March.

Things are not getting worse. They are getting exposed. Yes, that is an over simplification, but it is true. Part of our job is to keep things exposed and talk about and build alternatives. Alternatives old and new. We must stop the gutting of Social Security, Medicaid, Medicare, Obamacare and improve them. We need to stop the attacks on a free press, dissenters, whistleblowers, people of color, women's health and freedom, lesbians and gays, the public-school system and all education, the environment by global warming and pollution, scientific research, immigrants, Muslims, civil rights, civil dialogue and even common decency. We need to protect the vulnerable from those who would operate in this manic culture to gas-light us into thinking that we cannot add 2 and 2 and come up with 4.

Defending ourselves is necessary but it is not enough. There is an elephant in the room that must be addressed: the military-industrial complex and our addiction to war. Martin Luther King, Jr. talked about racism and materialism as social evils, but he also talked about militarism. In 1967 he said: "My government is the greatest purveyor of violence in the world today." The war-making capacity of the US is beyond justification and may

eventually kill us all. In bipartisan efforts, Democrats and Republicans have over decades spent at least 14 trillion dollars that could easily have been better used almost anywhere else. The government wants to spend a trillion over the next 30 years on the nuclear arsenal—our weapons of mass destruction. And drone warfare, as Leon Panetta said, is "the only game in town."

War is terrorism with a bigger budget. When the professional soldiers, the corporate lawyers, and the stratospheric money managers get together, breaking into the vault as they did yesterday [the inauguration], watch out! We are all under the gun now. The arrogance of the idea that America is the exceptional, indispensable nation entitled to own and rule the world is appalling and brutal.

As an older, white middle-class peacenik, I can only imagine what so many have suffered. But I will not be a mushroom: I will not dwell in the dark and be fed crap. I refuse to live in isolation and fear. A gun for every man and every man with a gun is not a human way to live—it is a nightmare.

It is good to be here today, building community, trying to create a Movement. A Movement for Peace and Justice and Human Rights for all; nonviolent and hoping to give us a chance to give this planet and all life on it a chance to survive and prosper.

A Reading of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King's April 4, 1967 Riverside Speech

Wilton, former owner of a health food store on Main Street in Binghamton, now lives in the back woods of Pennsylvania but drives to where the action is. Just consider his past two weeks: first arrive at the Federal Building for Peace Action's MLK event on April 3rd. Then drive back home, edit and by late that same night has it on YouTube and his own site at www.otherchoicesother-voices.com. Next day, off to Washington, DC to video and mainstream David Swanson, Medea Benjamin and other talents at a progressive site restaurant near DuPont Circle.

Next day he's at American University in the classroom of nationally known journalist, Colman McCarthy and the following day at Catholic University trying to keep his expensive video gear dry in downpours around the campus. Then, District of Columbia through a traffic snarl and a dark pounding rain for a five-hour drive home.

More intense editing. Then, off to Syracuse with Ann and Jim Clune and Jack Gilroy to video document a Good Friday direct-action event at a killer drone base. Nine people were arrested including three 'crucified' representing people we kill with Hellfire missiles triggered at Hancock's 174th Attack Wing. All this is now recorded as documents to be found Wilton's site or Google "Wilton Vought, other choices other voices."

From all of us at Peace Action of Broome and Veterans for Peace, we say, "Thank you, Wilton. You are an unsung historian of peace and justice."

A Pipeline War?

On February 25, 2016, Robert F. Kennedy, Jr. published an article on EcoWatch.com called "Syria: Another Pipeline War." It's a long piece, thoroughly reviewing the history of the U.S., specifically the CIA, meddling in Middle East governments. The top graphic is a map of two proposed pipelines. One, the Qatar-Turkey natural gas pipeline which was supposed to run from Qatar through Saudi Arabia, Jordan, Syria, and Turkey. This pipeline would have given the Sunni kingdoms an economic advantage. The other pipeline, labeled the Muslim pipeline, would have run from Iran through Iraq and Syria to Lebanon and given the advantage to Shia Iran. According to this article, it was Basher Assad's refusal in 2009 to sign onto the Qatar-Saudi pipeline and to endorse the Iran pipeline that triggered a US, Saudi, Israeli consensus that Assad had to go.

Yes, underneath all the layers of regional rivalries and ethnic and religious tensions, the US involvement is all about natural gas. It's a pipeline war. It's a resource war. The US interest is basically about economic and political dominance. This interest is only recently, and conveniently, about humanitarian intervention. So

now we have a Sarin gas outbreak that the US claims is Assad's doing and the Syrians and Russians saying it was an accident when a rebel base was hit. The murkiness of assigning responsibility was quickly brushed aside, ignoring calls for real investigations. The new US president, now had a chance to look tough and compassionate. "Trump" and "compassionate" in the same sentence? Huh? Mr. "travel ban" and "build a wall" and "America First" actually caring about children suffocating and dying? By sending in the cruise missiles? I don't buy it.

The real tragedy is that the mass media and top Democratic politicians are buying it. A mob mentality is rearing its ugly head in DC again.

Peace will not come when we are not honest about our real motivations for fighting. Making money by taking resources from others, and from selling armaments to all sides in the ensuing chaos will not work. As long as the US keeps making money in these ways, we will all keep sending children to early graves.

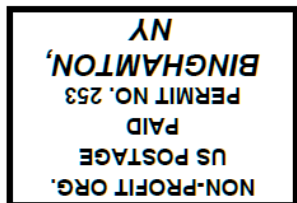
